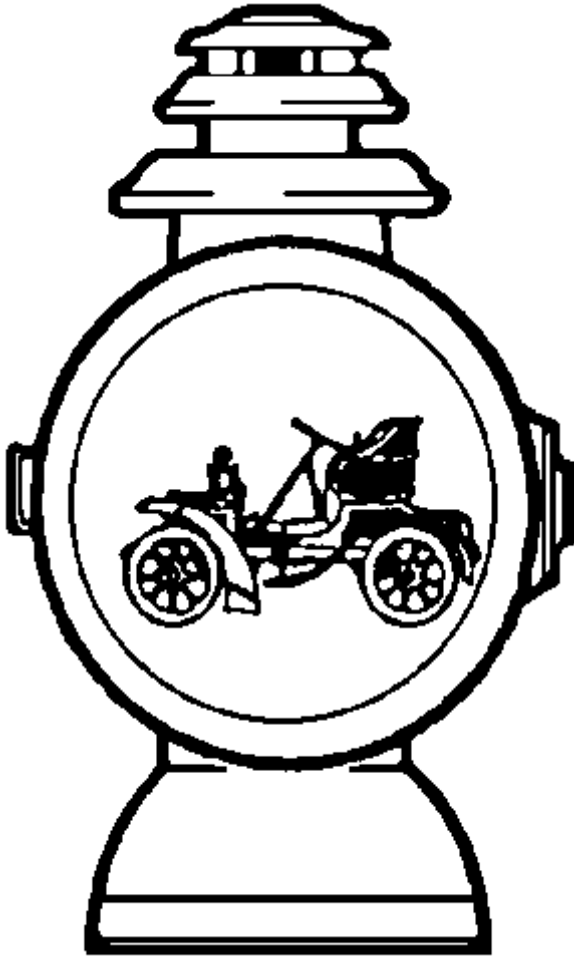

Ed. can't help but wonder what jobs are in that missing 2%.



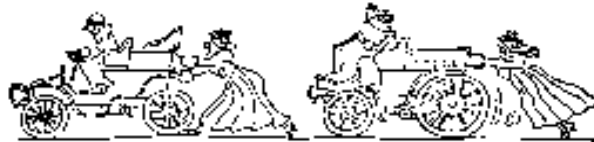
